Theme of the Month

This month, we're embracing the great outdoors and all the rich language it inspires! **Our May theme, "Building Language Through Nature, Life Cycles, and Outdoor Adventures,"** gives your child the opportunity to explore new words, ask questions, follow directions, and connect with others — all through hands-on, engaging activities that follow speech and language milestones and Common Core standards. Take a peek at what we're doing each week — and how you can join the fun from home!

Week 1: Let's go camping!

Language Focus:

- Vocabulary: tent, marshmallow, bug, flashlight
- Skills: requesting, sequencing, following directions
- Speech Targets: initial sounds, multisyllabic words
- Social Focus: taking turns, making choices
- **At-Home Idea:** Build a living room "campsite" and go on a pretend adventure! Try naming items or telling a campfire story together.



Week 2: Campfire Connections-Problem Solving with Friends

Language Focus:

- **Problem-solving words and phrases:** "What can we do?", "Let's try...", "That didn't work!"
- Emotional vocabulary: frustrated, excited, confused, calm
- Skills: identifying problems, offering solutions, expressing feelings
- Speech Targets: sentence building, using "I" statements, turn-taking language
- Social Focus: cooperation, asking for help, compromising
- **At-Home Idea:** Set up a small pretend problem during playtime, like "Oh no! The tent won't stay up!" or "There's only one marshmallow left!" Talk through the problem with your child and brainstorm solutions together.



Week 3: Rainy Day Campers — Adapting to the Unexpected

Language Focus:

- Flexible thinking words: "maybe," "instead," "next time," "another way"
- Emotion words: disappointed, surprised, okay, flexible
- **Skills:** adjusting to change, using coping language, understanding cause/effect
- **Speech Targets:** combining thoughts ("I wanted to... but we can..."), using "if/then" phrases
- **Social Focus:** perspective-taking, accepting new ideas, staying regulated when plans change
- **At-Home Idea:** Have a "pretend rainy day" at home maybe your pretend hike gets rained out and you have to camp indoors instead.



Week 4: Last Day at Camp — Saying Goodbye and Going Home

Language Focus:

- Farewell and transition words: goodbye, see you later, going home, last day
- Emotion words: happy, sad, proud, excited, nervous
- Skills: reflecting on experiences, expressing feelings, using "past tense" language
- **Speech Targets:** sentence starters ("I liked...", "My favorite part was..."), sequencing past events
- **Social Focus:** closing conversations, showing appreciation, managing "big feelings" about endings
- At-Home Idea: Have a mini "camp closing ceremony" at home! Look at photos from the month, talk about favorite parts of pretend camp, or make a pretend "go-home bag."
